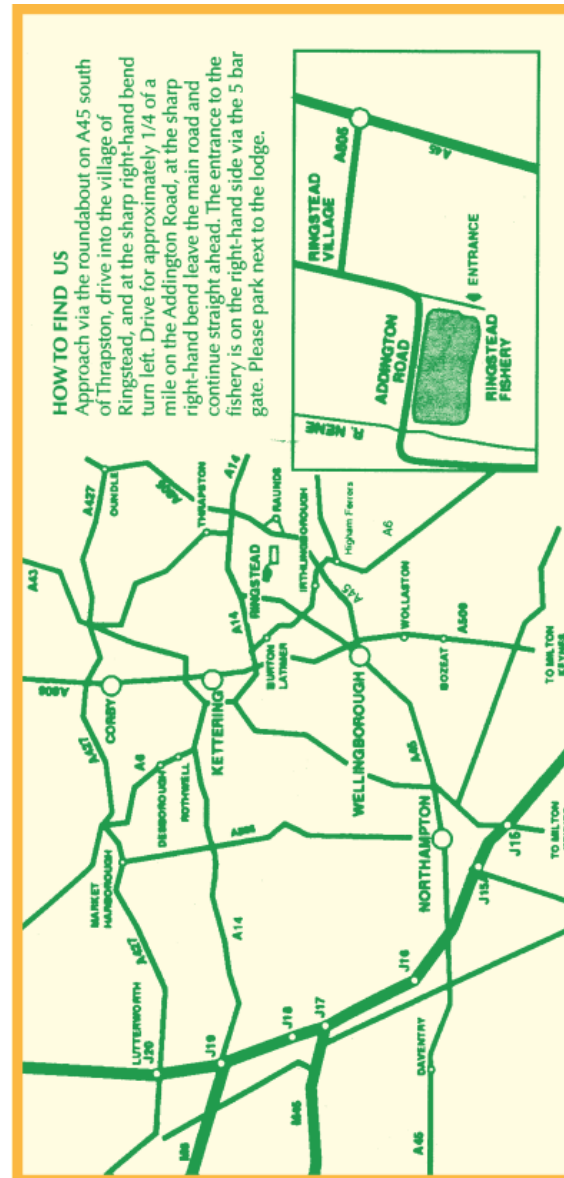

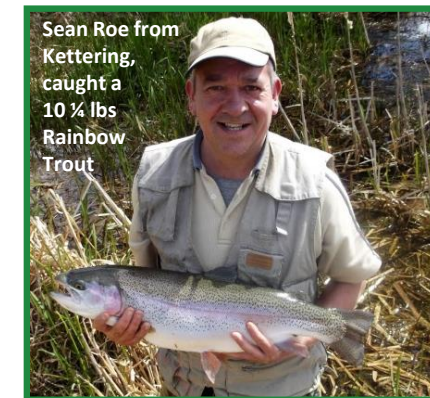
A14 (M1-A1 Link Road) A605 and A45

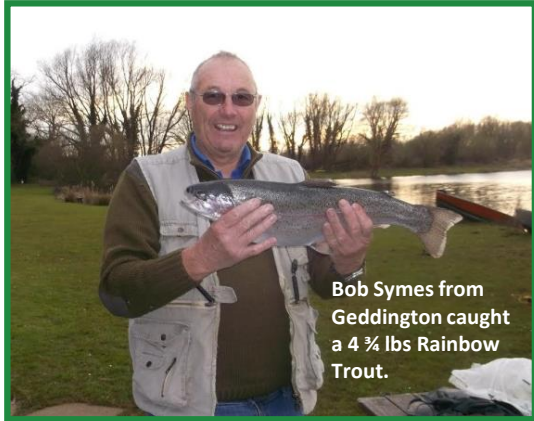

Ringstead Grange was established in 1975 and has proved one of the best value fisheries in the country.

Stocking is carried out regularly, which helps to provide consistent fish stock levels throughout the season.

The all-female and triploid Rainbows & Browns are stocked throughout the season.

Stock size range from a minimum 2lbs up to double figures in weight, the specimen fish stock levels being well supplemented by resident grown on fish.

There is much emphasis put on the quality of our stock as well as size, so expect to catch streamlined trout with a full complement of fins.

At the Lodge there is a gas stove for Anglers' use. There is also a Camping & Caravan Certificated site on the farm near to the fishery.

Bookings for Boat fishing are advisable; essential for weekends and Bank Holidays. 14 boats are available. The Fishery is well situated close to major roads.

Other season ticket options are also available for boats, C & R, husband and wife etc. All season permits cover the angler for unlimited visits during the season. The maximum number of fish to be killed is 100 but anglers may also catch and release.

ONLY SENSIBLE RULES AND REGULATIONS EXSIST

1. An EA Rod Licence is required.
2. Conventional Fly Fishing equipment only.
3. No Wading at any point on the Lake.
4. Wife and Family welcome with Day Ticket Anglers
5. On your way to a limit bag, fish may be returned only if shaken off the hook whilst still in water.
6. No Fishing allowed after limit bag has been reached, unless a second ticket has been purchased.
7. No dogs allowed at the fishery. Expect Guide Dogs
8. Boat Anglers are advised to wear life jackets in the boats at all times and these are available in the Lodge for Anglers use, but they must be returned to the Lodge at the end of the days fishing.
9. Anglers are required to complete catch returns after fishing and return these to the Lodge placing them in the returns box. This will then assist the fishery management with regular stocking policy.
10. All brown trout caught are to be returned safely to the Lake.

Disabled Anglers welcome; banks suitable in most places for fishing from wheeled chairs.

To counteract future weed problems in the lake, high powered weed cutters and weed lifters have now been made available and these will be utilised at the earliest stage and where necessary during the season to keep water clear.
